

Newtown Residents Petition - following a petition about the condition of the road surface in Newtown Cllr Andrew Eade (Rep: Church Aston & Lilleshall) has confirmed that T&WC have agreed to fund a drainage scheme and a road surfacing scheme.

Funding for these works will be available in the new financial year i.e. 2020/21. A drainage scheme to help prevent surface water run-off entering private gardens will be carried out first. Once these drainage works are completed a repair and resurfacing scheme for the road will be implemented. All works should be finished no later than March 2021, hopefully much sooner.

Meantime, the Parish Council look forward to continuing to work closely with Cllr Eade for the benefit of Church Aston Parish.
